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SAILING STANDARDS and INFORMATION

GENERAL

Three registered classes are established at PYC; L.M.P.H.R.F, Sunfish Fleet No. 218, and Ensign Fleet No. 70. PYC also sponsors an Offshore Fleet and an Open Fleet.

The Racing Rules of Sailing 2005-2008, published by US Sailing, will govern the racing rules, scoring system, and protest procedures. Course charts, sailing instructions, special notices, and changes to these rules will be printed in this book, posted on the Club bulletin board, posted on the website, and/or announced at the skippers meeting before the affected race(s). Generally, there will be a small race fee charged for each race in which an offshore yacht participates. Current race standings will be posted on the Club bulletin board. Trophies are awarded by each fleet to qualifying members who have met all current obligations to the club.

Scoring in all fleets except Sunfish will be by boat. Sunfish scoring will be based on the skipper, NOT the boat.

If a Sunfish sailor, or any yacht, starts in one race of a series, that sailor (or yacht) will be considered entered in all races for that series, and will receive DNS for any race the sailor (yacht) does not sail in that series.

SCORING (ALL FLEETS)

Scoring will be as provided in Appendix A of the US Sailing Racing Rules using the Low Point System. One point will be awarded for first place, 2 for second, etc. The handicapping system used, if any, will be at the election of the individual fleets. If a race or series includes more than one fleet, the Regatta Committee will, if necessary, arbitrate the handicapping.

DNC (did not come to the starting area) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race. If a race is missed because the boat is participating in a regional or national event for its fleet or class, for the missed race, the boat will be awarded the average of its other scores in the entire series.

DNS (did not start) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.

DNF (did not finish) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.

DSQ (disqualified) receives three more points than the last boat to finish the race in question.

The skipper of any racing yacht is required to be knowledgeable of the US Sailing rules, and agrees to race by these rules. The skipper is also responsible for the safe operation of his/her yacht and the safety of the crew. The Regatta Committee recommends that skippers familiarize their crews with all safety procedures, including man overboard drills, as often as necessary for the safe operation of the yacht.

PROTESTS AND ARBITRATION (ALL FLEETS)

Arbitration will be offered for all protests. The Arbitrator will be assigned by the Chairman of Protests or Chairman of the Regatta Committee. The Arbitrator will meet with both parties. If he/she finds the protest to be invalid, or if significant damage occurred, then the session is ended. If protest is valid, then both parties are given five minutes to present cases. After five minute presentation time for each party and time for the Arbitrator to ask a few questions, The Arbitrator will state (1) no rule was broken (2) one or both boats broke a rule (3) Arbitrator is unable to reach a decision. It will not be revealed why any boat broke a rule or what rule was broken. If the Arbitrator believes that one boat broke a rule such boat will be invited to accept a 40% scoring penalty. If the protestor does not accept an invitation to withdraw the protest, or if the protested boat does not accept the penalty, or if the Mediator is unable to make a decision, then a full protest hearing is held.

PRINCIPAL RACE OFFICER (Ensign and Open Classes)

1. A Principal Race Officer (PRO) will be assigned by the Regatta Committee for each race from list of boat owners. In the event that more than one person owns a boat, the owners must assign one candidate.
2. If the assigned person unable to serve, the Regatta Committee chairman or designate shall be notified no later than one day before the race. A successor will be selected from the list of owners.
3. PRO duties
 - a. Select course
 - b. Set, or oversee the setting, of the starting line buoys.
 - c. Contact race committee if race to be delayed or postponed
 - d. Contact race committee if race to be shortened or abandoned.
 - e. PRO must forward promptly any protests to the Chairman of the protest committee, or his designate.
4. Default rules
 - a. Races to start at 11 AM unless wind speed at starting line less than 5 mph or greater than 20 mph
 - b. Races to start at location designated by Regatta Committee. There are two possibilities;
 - i. Start and end at PYC
 - ii. Start near mark "D" and finish at PYC
 - c. Course to be selected from the standard list of courses. The PRO will notify the Race Committee of the selected course.
 - d. Races to be shortened only if first finisher unlikely to finish in 2 hours, or wind speed dropping substantially
 - e. Only races with a leg that includes the turning buoy (T) can be shortened
 - f. Races to be abandoned only if threatening weather or very low wind speed.
5. Arbitration
 - a. The PRO will serve as the arbitrator for the race for the race just completed, with the following exceptions:
 - i. The PRO is involved in the protest
 - ii. The PRO refuses
 - b. If the PRO does not serve as arbitrator, a replacement will be selected from a list of PROs for previous races, selected in reverse order (most recent race first).

SERIOUS DAMAGE

Regarding Rules 44.1, 60.3 and 63.5:

1. Serious damage is the breakage of any part of the boat, including the hull, brightwork, standing rigging, or sails.
2. Scuffing of the rubrail, or scratches which do not penetrate to the underlying fiberglass, are not considered serious damage.

OFFSHORE FLEET

Skippers Meetings will be held one hour before each race except for special races outside of this schedule. Special race instructions will be posted on the PYC bulletin board and on the PYC Web Site.

Racing rules, scoring, and other conditions for racing will conform to the Sailing Standards and Information as outlined in the PYC membership book. Cancellation of offshore races will be the responsibility of the PRO if in his judgment the race cannot be moved to the Pentwater Lake Course.

1. Start time may be adjusted based on weather and other considerations. Changes will be posted on the PYC bulletin board, and will be emailed if time permits.
2. Races will be held on Lake Michigan, if feasible. Races may be moved to Pentwater Lake if the PRO deems it necessary.
3. Time limits for each race will be determined before each race by the PRO.
4. Each finishing boat will review and initial the scoring book upon completing each race. Not signing the scoring book the day of the race acknowledges acceptance of the race committee's results.
5. A valid PHRF certificate or a signed affidavit affirming the boat rating conforms to identical class boats in the PHRF handicap book will be accepted.
6. The Regatta Committee will consider both main/jib and spinnaker section starts pending interest and participation by boat owners.
7. Adequate Liability Insurance (certificate copy on file) will be required to race. Amount to be determined by the Regatta Committee

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NOTICE

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SAILBOAT RACES: All fleets, boats and individuals participating in sailing races or activities organized by the Club do so with the understanding that the Club, as the organizing authority, makes the final determination about all aspects of that race or activity. Perhaps you and I should send the following information to the Ensign email list..

 Ensign sailors:

1. The Regatta Committee has passed a few rules that are new this year. Some of these are in the directory, and a copy of the pertinent part of that is attached. There are a couple of others:

- a. "One of the boat's owners must act as helmsman on at least the first and last legs of each race. The first leg is defined as beginning 1 minute before the start signal, and ending after the first mark has been rounded. The last leg is defined as starting before the boat has begun to round the last mark, and ending after the boat has finished."

This rule is in the spirit of rules for the Farr 40 class. It was discussed at the 4/30/2006 fleet meeting. Note that it is considerably more lenient than the rules for Ensign Regional and National Championships. If you have a boat with more than one owner, or a non-owner skipper, it would be useful to read the Ensign rules prior to the Region 5 Championships.

b. Regarding Rules 44.1, 60.3 and 63.5:

- o Serious damage is the breakage of any part of the boat, including the hull, brightwork, standing rigging, or sails.
 - o Scuffing of the rubrail, or scratches which do not penetrate to the underlying fiberglass, are not considered serious damage
- 'Serious damage' is cited in the Rules, but not defined. This definition was discussed at the 4-30-2006 Ensign Fleet meeting, and was supported by that group.

2. The 2006 racing schedule is also in the attached Directory information.

3. The new Ensign rules call for a minimum weight of 2800 pounds for the hull, spars and standing rigging. We have built a weighing system, which is at Patterson Marine. All boats should be weighed prior to launching. Please contact Jack to arrange this. It shouldn't take more than a few minutes.

4. We have a template for measuring sails for the Regionals. All sails should be measured before the 2006 season.

- 1 ROSEMAN CALLED THE MEETING OF THE ENSIGN FLEET 70 OF PENTWATER LAKE, PENTWATER MICHIGAN, TO ORDER AS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PYC REGATTA COMMITTEE AND IN THE ABSENCE OF ARNIE SAMUEL WHO HAS RESIGNED AS THE CAPTAIN OF ENSIGN FLEET 70. ROSEMAN SAID THAT THE FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS IS TO NOMINATE AND VOTE FOR A FLEET CAPTAIN.
- 2 STURR MOVED TO THANK SAMUEL FOR HIS SERVICE AS THE FLEET CAPTAIN AND TO NOMINATE JACK PATTERSON AS FLEET 70 CAPTAIN. HILTON SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED. ROSEMAN TO INDICATE THIS CHANGE TO ART HAAN THE PYC COMMODORE.
- 3 PATTERSON COMMENCED TO CHAIR THE MEETING AND NOMINATED STURR AS THE SECRETARY AND GARY NICHOLSEN TO CONTINUE AS THE TREASURE. LEHAYE SECONDED THE NOMINATIONS WHICH WERE UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED.
- 4 PATTERSON ASKED FOR A DUES INCREASE SINCE THIS YEAR ADDITIONAL EXPENSES OF APPROXIMATELY \$800 WILL BE EXPENSED FOR A BOAT WEIGHING SYSTEM . THAT WEIGHING SYSTEM WILL BE USABLE BY ANY PYC FLEET SUCH AS THE J 24'S WHO HAVE BOAT WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS AND UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES BY OTHER FLEETS OUTSIDE OF THE PYC. ROSEMAN EXPLAINED THE BASICS OF THE DESIRED SYSTEM AND THEN MOVED TO INCREASE THE YEARLY DUES OF FLEET 70 TO \$30 WHICH WAS SECONDED BY STURR AND UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED.
- 5 PATTERSON REVIEWED SAIL MEASUREMENT PROCEDURES. HILTON MOVED AND LEHAYE SECONDED TO HAVE THE FLEET BOAT SAILS MEASURED THIS SPRING. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

6 PATTERSON INITIATED A LONG DISCUSSION OF THE PYC HOSTING THE ENSIGN REGIONALS FROM JULY FRIDAY 14TH THROUGH SUNDAY JULY 16. THAT WOULD ENTAIL BOAT WEIGHING AND SAIL MEASUREMENTS AND ONE OR TWO RACES ON THE 14TH, THREE RACES ON THE 15TH AND ONE RACE AND AWARDS ON THE 16TH. STURR MOVED THAT WE REQUEST THE PYC BOARD TO APPROVE THE HOSTING OF THE ENSIGN REGIONALS AS DESCRIBED ABOVE, LEHAYE SECONDED THE MOTION AND ALL APPROVED. PATTERSON TO FORWARD THIS REQUEST TO HAAN FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE BOARD IN THE NEXT TWO WEEKS. ANNOUNCEMENTS REGARDING THE PYC HOST OF THIS RACE SERIES TO INTERESTED PARTICIPANTS WOULD BE NECESSARY BY MID FEBRUARY.

7 ROSEMAN MOVED TO HAVE LEHAYE CHAIR THE REGIONAL RACE EFFORT SHOULD THE BOARD APPROVE OF THE PYC AS HOST, STURR SECONDED THE MOTION AND ALL APPROVED. Dear Board:

I am writing to object to the handling of the Regatta Committee's requests at the April Board meeting. I think that both the decisions and the process were flawed.

The Regatta Committee is a standing committee. We are volunteers, appointed by the Commodore. We met in October, January and March, and carefully considered the recommendations that we made. We have spent scores of hours scheduling races, obtaining permits, proposing Yearbook content, etc. Our collective boating experience is many decades long, and includes tens of thousands of miles of sailing. It is likely that we have more expertise about boating than the combined experience of the board.

I attended the meeting at the Commodore's request. The board meeting was held in the small bar room of the club. There were some rows of chairs placed in the doorway, extending out into the dining area. My presentation was from the back of that row of chairs, out of view of much of the board. Seated in front of me were two PYC members who are organizers of the Pentwater Sail Racing Association (PSRA). This is a group that is sponsoring races that conflict and compete with the PYC's offshore racing program. One of these members commented on each of our requests, and appeared to influence the board's decisions. These comments were clearly out of order. Certainly, the comments may well have been self-serving, contrary to the best interests of the PYC, and should have been viewed with substantial skepticism.

Commodore Haan had requested that the Regatta Committee support an Elwin Kent Memorial Race, which we did. The board was unhappy with various aspects of our proposal, partially based on the statement of one of the PSRA members, who said that the proposed date would conflict with a race at the Ludington Yacht Club. That race is organized by the PSRA. It seems clear where the club's obligation lies. Nevertheless, the Regatta Committee met the day after your board meeting, and unanimously agreed to withdraw our request and support for the Kent race.

Another of our requests was that the PYC accept the donation of a 20' boat for use as a committee boat. This boat would be used to set racing marks, and/or to start and finish races. The Finance Committee recommended against this, a fact that was not discussed with us before your meeting. Their recommendation was based on the fact that the boat would cost the club several hundred dollars per year. At the same time, you approved about \$2,000 for labor costs for painting the interior of the club. Most improvements at the club have been done by volunteers—building the decks and Junior room, installing the new windows, siding and insulation, repairing the underpinnings of the club, wiring for the POS system, etc, etc. There would have been no difficulty finding volunteers to paint the interior. If there is enough money to hire painters, there would have been enough money to pay the expenses associated with this boat.

Part of your decision seemed to have been based on non-financial issues, issues with which our committee has substantial expertise. Of course, you did not provide a solution to the committee

boat problem. We will continue to borrow members' boats, most of which are less well suited than the boat in question.

A principal purpose of the club is "... is to stimulate and improve all water activities including sailing, power boating, and associated sports ..." (Bylaws, Article 2.) The Regatta Committee is a major agent in carrying out that purpose. The PYC would be a poorer organization if sailing were not a prominent activity. There seems to be an opinion that racing is somehow harmful to the club, the bylaws notwithstanding. Racing and dining are not mutually exclusive. Both have grown substantially over the past several years. The club needs both.

The PYC is largely a volunteer organization. As we pass through Flag positions and board membership, we are temporarily given the responsibility for making decisions for the club. The attitude of the board toward the Regatta Committee was high-handed and dismissive. This approach should be unacceptable to everyone who has worked to build the club to its present level. I think it does a major disservice to the PYC.

To summarize, we have a knowledgeable and functional standing committee that is working hard toward a major purpose of the PYC. We made a few carefully-considered and modest requests of the board. These were rejected or tabled in a fashion that completely disregarded the actions of our committee. You appeared to be influenced by out-of-order comments by a member who is working at cross purposes with the PYC's program.

If you treat other members with the same disrespect shown for our committee, you may have difficulty finding the volunteers that have been the club's lifeblood. I promise you that you have dampened my enthusiasm, and my willingness to participate.

Proposed change for 14.C

14. Safety Equipment

C. Electronic Instruments, such as knot meter, VHF radio, depth finder, wind speed, and wind direction are permitted. They must however, stand -alone. This means that the instruments shall not be used to display calculated values, including true wind direction and velocity made good. Use of GPS for the purpose of providing navigational information is not allowed while racing. Radio usage, including VHF, cellular telephone, and all other wireless connections, is allowed during racing. Communications using such devices are limited to that expressly permitted in the Sailing Instructions for a given race.

Rationale. The present rule is ambiguous. The physical connection between instruments is normally done with 2 wires. Are instruments connected if the wire is in attached, but the instrument is not displaying the calculated values? If one of the wires is interrupted by a switch? If both wires are interrupted by a switch?

The intent is that true wind and VMG not be calculated to be used during a race. It seems reasonable to allow the instruments to remain connected, as long as they only display the raw data.

Regarding GPS, it seems reasonable to allow the use of GPS to provide boat speed. It is also reasonable to use the GPS to collect data about a race, to be used after the race, as long as navigational data are not used during the race.

It seems reasonable to cover cell phones and wireless internet connections, as well as VHF communications.

Proposed wording for roller furling

The 2003 Yearbook (page 99) says that local fleets could vote to allow roller furling for fleet-level racing. When this is incorporated into the rules, it would be useful to have a statement like "If roller furling is used for headsails, Rules H.1, J.1 and K.1 shall not apply."

Rationale. None of the available roller furling systems allows the use of snaphooks. This seems obvious, but was the subject of a burdensome protest in our fleet.

SAILING STANDARDS and INFORMATION

Draft 6

GENERAL

Three registered classes are established at PYC; L.M.P.H.R.F, Sunfish Fleet No. 218, and Ensign Fleet No. 70. PYC also sponsors an Offshore Fleet and an Open Fleet.

The Racing Rules of Sailing 2001-2004, published by US Sailing, will govern the racing rules, scoring system, and protest procedures. Course charts, sailing instructions, special notices, and changes to these rules will be printed in this book, posted on the Club bulletin board, posted on the website, and/or announced at the skippers meeting before the affected race(s). Generally, there will be a small race fee charged for each race in which an offshore yacht participates. Current race standings will be posted on the Club bulletin board. Trophies are awarded by each fleet to qualifying members who have met all current obligations to the club.

Scoring in all fleets except Sunfish will be by boat. Sunfish scoring will be based on the skipper, NOT the boat.

If a Sunfish sailor, or any yacht, starts in one race of a series, that sailor (or yacht) will be considered entered in all races for that series, and will receive DNS for any race the sailor (yacht) does not sail in that series.

SCORING (ALL FLEETS)

Scoring will be as provided in Appendix A of the US Sailing Racing Rules using the Low Point System. One point will be awarded for first place, 2 for second, etc. The handicapping system used, if any, will be at the election of the individual fleets. If a race or series includes more than one fleet, the Regatta Committee will, if necessary, arbitrate the handicapping.

DNC (did not come to the starting area) will be ³~~one~~ more point than the total number of boats in the race. series

DNS (did not start) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.

DNF (did not finish) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.

DSQ (disqualified) receives three more points than the last boat to finish the race in question.

DNR

The skipper of any racing yacht is required to be knowledgeable of the US Sailing rules, and agrees to race by these rules. The skipper is also responsible for the safe operation of his/her yacht and the safety of the crew. The Regatta Committee recommends that skippers familiarize their crews with all safety procedures, including man overboard drills, as often as necessary for the safe operation of the yacht.

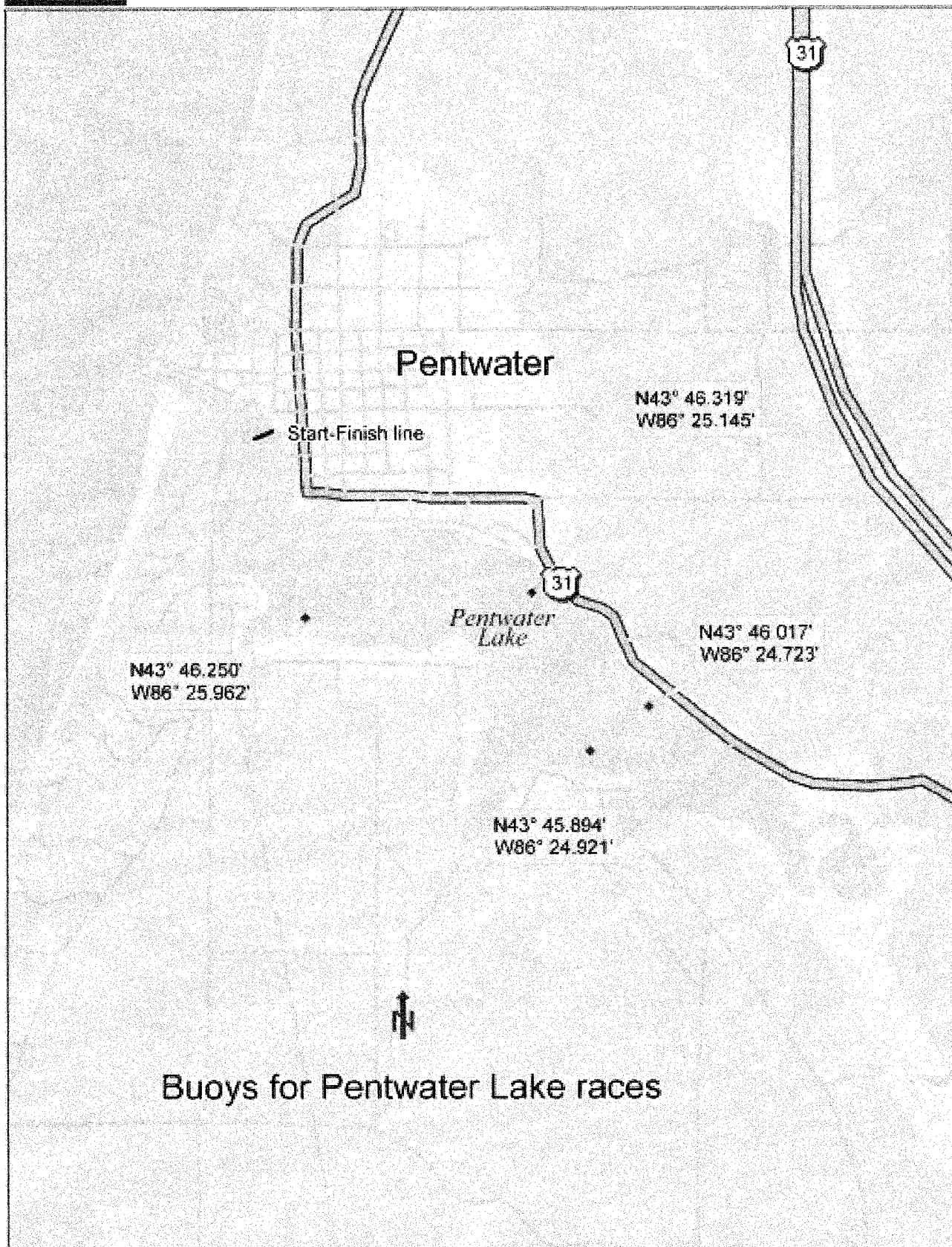

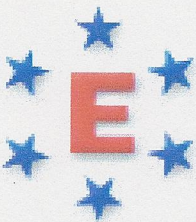

MINUTES

Ensign Fleet 70
Meeting April 18, 2004

Meeting called to Order at 1p.m. by Fleet Captain Samuel.

Boat Owners Present: Gary Nicholson, Bruce Vanderlaan, Michael LeHay, Tom Sturr, Jack Patterson, Tony Sisson, Larry Best, Arnie Samuel, Dave Roseman, Phil Arnold.

The minutes of the last meeting which were approved without reading and the agenda for this meeting were presented.

1. Five-Minute Race Start Procedure - Both discussed and explained by Jack Patterson and Dave Roseman, who designed the program. It was stressed that each boat participating in the race insure that the boat name and sail number are given to the race committee to be entered on the racing sheet for that race in order to be scored.
2. The Protests by Bruce Vanderlaan were reported to have been denied in all particulars. A written opinion was received from the Protest Committee to the Fleet Captain. Dave Roseman expressed the hope that the turmoil in the fleet and the inordinate amount of time committed to these protests was finally over. Mr. Vanderlaan advised the fleet that he has already appealed the decision to the next level.
3. Dues of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) were established. The dues are to be paid by May 1st with checks written out to Gary L. Nicholson, the fleet Treasurer. The following members paid their dues at this meeting; LeHay, Sisson, Best, Arnold and Nicholson. It was also determined that one boat had one vote in fleet matters even if there were multiple owners. The boat owners have to determine among themselves who gets to cast the vote. The dues are \$15.00 per boat. If anyone else wants to contribute, i.e., co-owners or crew members, they are welcome to do so but not required.
4. It was stressed that the bands on the mast and boom are required to be painted as opposed to taped. The proper location of the bands is described in the rule book.
5. Rule changes - Dave Roseman proposed rule changes regarding electronic equipment and roller furling to clarify the language. It will be discussed further at the next meeting.
6. Sailing instructions - The sailing instructions were reviewed by Fleet Captain Samuel and passed out to all present. General discussion was held and comments and questions were answered.

It was suggested by Roseman that each skipper take responsibility for an individual race so that responsibility for race organization can be passed around to the fleet. No action was taken at this time.

7. Social activities - Tony Sisson, Social Chairman, reported that the first potluck dinner would be held May 21st at the Sisson's home. Tony reports that 75-80 people are active in the fleet. The Muskegon Yacht Club has invited the fleet and its members to dinner at their club which is served Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights. Sisson is also organizing Sunday evening "rafting parties" and more information will be provided.
8. Lake Michigan series on Sundays - Bill DeHommel is organizing and will furnish further information about Sunday Lake Michigan races. They will start sometime after July 4th. The Point Sauble race is scheduled for Sunday, July 4, 2004.
9. Things for the good of the fleet -
 1. Tom Sturr presented a mission statement for the fleet to review and it will be taken up at the next meeting.
 2. Jack Patterson asked to approach the PYC Board to request that the Ensign fleet numbers be listed in the yearbook. It was determined that it was too late for this year but will be considered for next year.
 3. Larry Best raised an issue regarding Bruce Vanderlaan's "disruption of the fleet" including the filing of what he terms "harassing and unnecessary protests" involving matters easily resolved by discuss and/or simply inspection of boats. Sisson discussees one of his crew's refusal to participate in races with Vanderlaan because of conduct on the course. Also mentioned was the detrimental effect Mr. Vanderlaan is having on the fleet's morale and the fleet's reputation with other fleets. It was suggested that some sort of discipline be considered. It was reported that after conversations with the rules committee at the ECA, that if there are no bylaw provisions regarding discipline, the only remedy is to deny an individual membership in the fleet if the fleet felt that was appropriate. Motion by Best, seconded by Sisson, to reject Bruce Vanderlaan from consideration for membership in the fleet for the 2004 racing season. A secret ballot was taken without objection; counting supervised by Al Docter, resulting in an affirmative vote of nine (9) in favor and one (1) against. Motion carried. Bruce Vanderlaan will not be allowed to participate in Fleet 70 races for the 2004 racing season.

SAILING STANDARDS and INFORMATION

Draft 7

GENERAL

Three registered classes are established at PYC; L.M.P.H.R.F, Sunfish Fleet No. 218, and Ensign Fleet No. 70. PYC also sponsors an Offshore Fleet and an Open Fleet.

The Racing Rules of Sailing 2001-2004, published by US Sailing, will govern the racing rules, scoring system, and protest procedures. Course charts, sailing instructions, special notices, and changes to these rules will be printed in this book, posted on the Club bulletin board, posted on the website, and/or announced at the skippers meeting before the affected race(s). Generally, there will be a small race fee charged for each race in which an offshore yacht participates. Current race standings will be posted on the Club bulletin board. Trophies are awarded by each fleet to qualifying members who have met all current obligations to the club.

Scoring in all fleets except Sunfish will be by boat. Sunfish scoring will be based on the skipper, NOT the boat.

If a Sunfish sailor, or any yacht, starts in one race of a series, that sailor (or yacht) will be considered entered in all races for that series, and will receive DNS for any race the sailor (yacht) does not sail in that series.

SCORING (ALL FLEETS)

Scoring will be as provided in Appendix A of the US Sailing Racing Rules using the Low Point System. One point will be awarded for first place, 2 for second, etc. The handicapping system used, if any, will be at the election of the individual fleets. If a race or series includes more than one fleet, the Regatta Committee will, if necessary, arbitrate the handicapping.

- ✓ **DNC** (did not come to the starting area) will be three more points than the total number of boats in the race.
- ✓ **DNS** (did not start) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.
- ✓ **DNF** (did not finish) will be one more point than the total number of boats in the race.
- ✓ **DSQ** (disqualified) receives three more points than the last boat to finish the race in question.

The skipper of any racing yacht is required to be knowledgeable of the US Sailing rules, and agrees to race by these rules. The skipper is also responsible for the safe operation of his/her yacht and the safety of the crew. The Regatta Committee recommends that skippers familiarize their crews with all safety procedures, including man overboard drills, as often as necessary for the safe operation of the yacht.

Ordinarily, if there are fewer than four Open boats for a Pentwater Lake race, they will start with the Ensigns. If four or more, the boats will start 15 minutes after the Ensigns.

Offshore Fleet

Races cancelled on Saturday will be rescheduled for the following day. Times for the makeup races will be announced at the time of cancellation.

1. Start time may be changed based on weather and other considerations. Changes will be posted on the PYC bulletin board, and will be e-mailed if time permits.
2. Races will be held on Lake Michigan, if feasible. Races may be moved to Pentwater Lake if required by weather or other conditions.
3. Time limits for each race will be determined by the Race Chairman. If there is no designated chairman, the limits will be set by the Fleet Captain or his/her designate.
4. A valid, up-to-date PHRF certificate is required for a boat to qualify for awards.
5. Starting times will be handicapped for Main & Jib and Spinnaker divisions.

6. If three or more PYC boats participate in any sanctioned race, that race will be scored as if it were part of the scheduled Offshore Fleet races.
7. The results of the poorest finish for any boat in any one race in the championship series races will be discarded.

Report for spring Regatta Committee meeting
March 20, 2003

The Ensign fleet met on November 22, 2003. The following matters were taken up at the meeting.

1. The race schedule for the 2004 season was discussed and voted on. There will be no spring series this year. Instead 5/1 5/22 and 5/29 will be tune up races.
2. The summer series will be the fleet championship series and will be conducted on 6/5 6/12 6/19 6/26 7/3 7/10 7/17 7/24 7/31 8/7 and 8/14. The series will be based on the best 11 of the 14 races.
3. The fall series will be held on 8/21 8/28 9/4 9/11 9/18 and 9/25. The series winner will be based on the best 5 of 6 races.
4. The motion passed 8-0

The matter of exchanging start times with the Offshore fleet was discussed and it was felt that this could be done. As soon as the Offshore fleet is organized I will work out the dates with them.

A motion was made to change to a 5 minute start. passed 8-0

A motion was made to require all boats to have black bands on their mast and boom and to have sails measured. Passed 8-0.

A motion was made that all boat owners should be members of the ECA and of fleet #70 in order to race. Passed 8-0

A motion was made to allow fleet racing using roller furling without snap shackles again this year. Passed 7-1

A motion was made to use the same wording as last year concerning number of crew needed to race and the location of motors during a race. Passed 8-0

We are in the process of writing bylaws for the fleet. Letters have been sent to a number of fleets to see what they have. So far I have gotten two replies that indicate they do not have fleet bylaws.

On January 24 four members of the fleet; Arnie Samuel, Jack Patterson, Gary Nicholson and Mike LaHaye, attended the national meeting of the ECA in Nyack, NY.

Arnie Samuel and Gary Nicholson were elected Fleet Captain and Sec/treas respectively for the 2004 season.

Wednesday night sailing and dinner will be held again this summer. The fleet has met once a month this winter on Wednesday night to have dinner together. The average attendance has been 20 sailors at these winter meetings.

Bill DeHommel expressed an interest in doing some racing on the big lake. He has accepted the role of race committee chairman for these events and is presently working on their organization. They will be held on Sundays and will not conflict with already scheduled events.

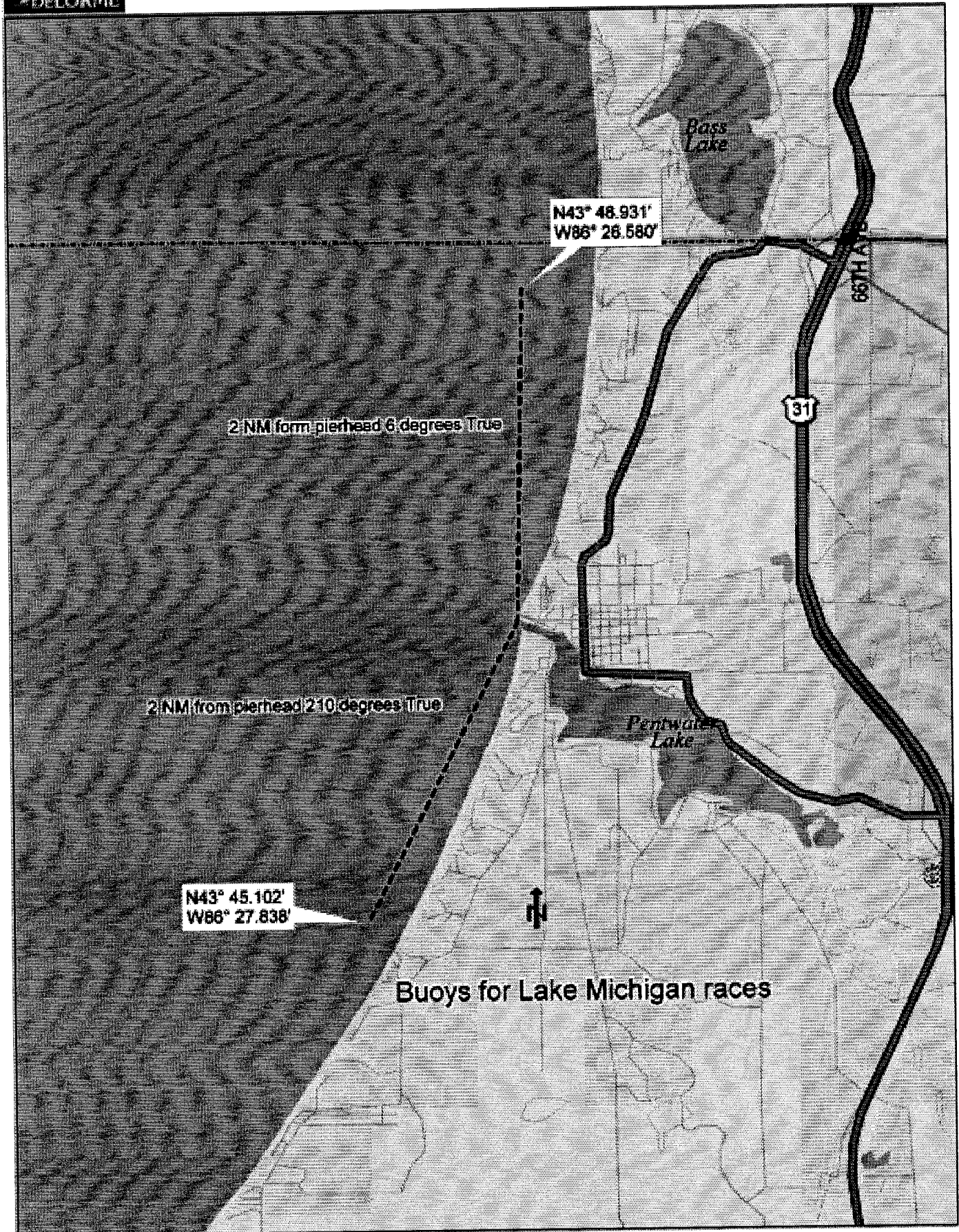

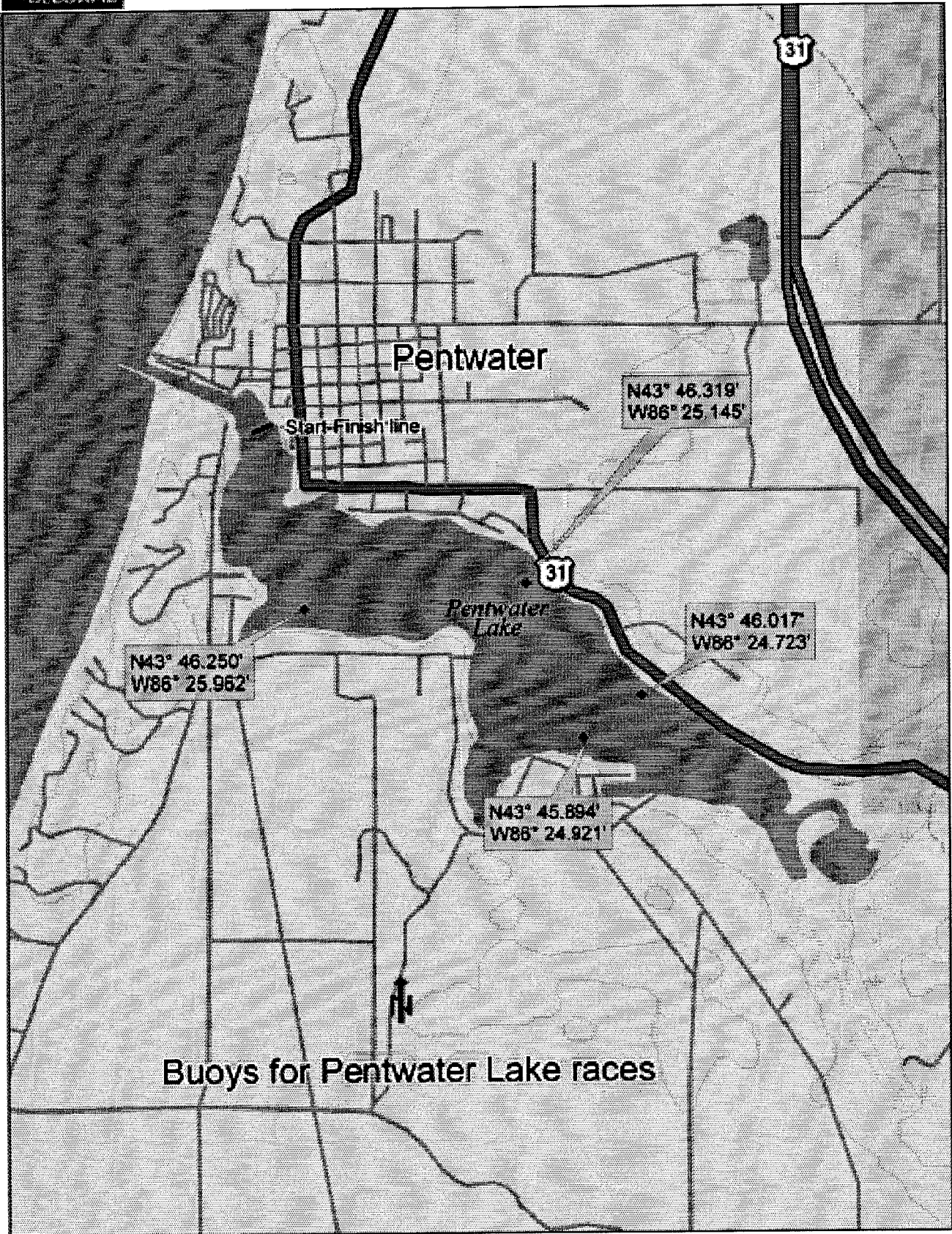

ENSIGN CLASS ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING 24 JANUARY 2004 NYACK, NY

The Annual Meeting hosted by Fleet 51 at the historic Nyack Boat Club, was brought to order by Commodore Woodruff at 1:42 P.M.

The Commodore gave thanks to the Nyack Boat Club and Fleet 51 for hosting the Friday night party and the Saturday meeting. The Commodore then introduced Judy Long, Fleet 51 Co-Captain and Mark Kamen, Nyack Boat Club Rear Commodore of Programs. Both made short welcoming remarks.

Roll Call of the fleets produced 46 members in attendance.

A reading of the minutes of the February 8, 2003 meeting was waived.

Past Commodores in attendance were Dick Torpey, Charlie Shoemaker, Zeke Durica, and Bob Warner.

Officers' Reports

Commodore Ward Woodruff thanked Past Commodore Dick Torpey and Accountant Walter Donovan for their pro bono work in filing necessary Tax returns with the IRS. As the ECA is a 501C3 organization, the ECA is required to file tax returns in any year that our gross receipts exceed \$25,000.00.

The 2004 National Championship Regatta Committee, The Houston Yacht Club, Fleet 2 members, Dean and Kay Snider and Regatta Co-Chairs, Dwight and Carol Lee Hollister were given praise for hosting and conducting the ECA Nationals last summer.

Thanks also went to Chris Kogut who continues to produce a photographic record of our Nationals.

Dr Bill Faget and Vice Commodore-Publicity, Dr. Doug Wood, were remembered.

The Class is strong. We have been planning for future events and have those events scheduled through 2006. The website continues to generate inquiries from those interested in the Ensign.

We all need to encourage our local fleet members to join the ECA.

Our Builder, Ensign Spars, Inc. continues to sell a couple of boats each year and working to establish a dealer network to assist in the sales process.

Our regatta liability insurance has been renewed for 2004. This provides financial protection to the ECA and its officers for on-water accidents that may occur during ECA sanctioned regattas.

The ECA needs a procedure for accepting donations of goods such as boats and then for the care and storage of those donations until they are resold.

The following annual appointments have been made: Ned Blade, RC-Yearbook; Dirk Van Zyverden, RC-Newsletter; Sarah Statmore, RC-boat list; Walt Pratt-RC-Website.

Secretary Ron Hoffman reported that 114 sail patches, 2 sets of boat plans, and 10 bumper stickers were sold in 2003.

Treasurer Jorge Ibanez-Delgado reported that the ECA is solvent. That our cash balances as of 01/22/2004 are about \$35,097.69. 506 dues notices were mailed. To date there have been 300 replies. Jorge went on to state that membership is relatively flat. We seem to gain 80 new members each year but lose about 80 members at the same time. It is necessary for all members to work at the grass roots level to insure that all of their fleet members are also members of the ECA.

Some owners have called the treasurer attempting to determine the actual number of their hull. Some boats have missing builder's plaques at the aft end of the cockpit. Other boats it seems have had plaques from newer destroyed boats applied to the older boats. Some of this is innocent. In order to establish a database to insure that individual boats are properly identified, members need to please furnish the hull ID numbers requested with the 2004 dues notice.

Vice Commodore-Regional Affairs Elizabeth Brincklow reported the following information with respect to 2004 Regional Championships.

Region I - 6/26-27, 2004 Fleet 63 Island Heights, NJ

Region II, III - mid-July TBD Fleet 57 New London, CT

Region IV - May-June TBD Fleet 30 Austin, TX

Region V - July 17-18, 2004 Fleet 29 Cleveland, OH

Vice Commodore-Publicity Bill Blackman, our new VC-Publicity was introduced the group.

Vice Commodore-Rules Eric Jones was attending a funeral in Maine so was not

in attendance at this meeting.

**A minimum boat weight rule and a rule change regarding the placement of the
ade jib tracks and blade jib clew height will be studied.**

Contributions Dick Torpey indicated that an appeal letter will be going to the membership. Donations to the ECA are tax deductible.

Rear Commodore-Boat List, Sarah Statmore indicated that there are about 50 boats looking for new owners and about 50 people looking for boats at any one time. Sarah communicates with almost all exclusively by e-mail. During the course of the last year Sarah has made estimates of boat value for two insurance claims and one divorce settlement.

New Boat Project – Zeke Durica, President of Ensign Spars, our Class Boat Builder, revealed that he is retired from his day job and is now putting full effort into the Ensign. Five Boats have been delivered since the beginning of construction. Three boats are currently on order. Boat 2007 has been ordered by an active racer. Zeke expects that we will see 2007 on the race course this year.

**The ECA will be partially subsidizing Ensign Spars exhibit of a new boat at the Chicago Boat Show. The ECA will be funding repairs and gimbaling of the hull
old. Gimbaling will allow the hull mold to be rotated on the lengthwise axis to aid in laying up the hull. An additional advantage is that the mold can be stored upside down. This will prevent water and UV ray damage in storage.**

2004 Nationals – Charlie Shoemaker and Gary Smith reported on preparations for the Regatta the last week of August in Newport, RI. One practice Race and Eight Championship races are planned over 4 days. Gary Smith indicated that housing in Newport is relatively expensive. The committee has secured some deals with hotels. Make your reservations early.

2005 Nationals - Ron Hoffman indicated that the 2005 Nationals will be sailed on the Hudson River at Nyack, NY in September or October.

2005 Annual Meeting will be held in Cleveland, OH in February.

2006 Nationals – Wes Kroeze indicated that Edgewater Yacht Club in Cleveland, OH will be the site of the Nationals the third week in August.

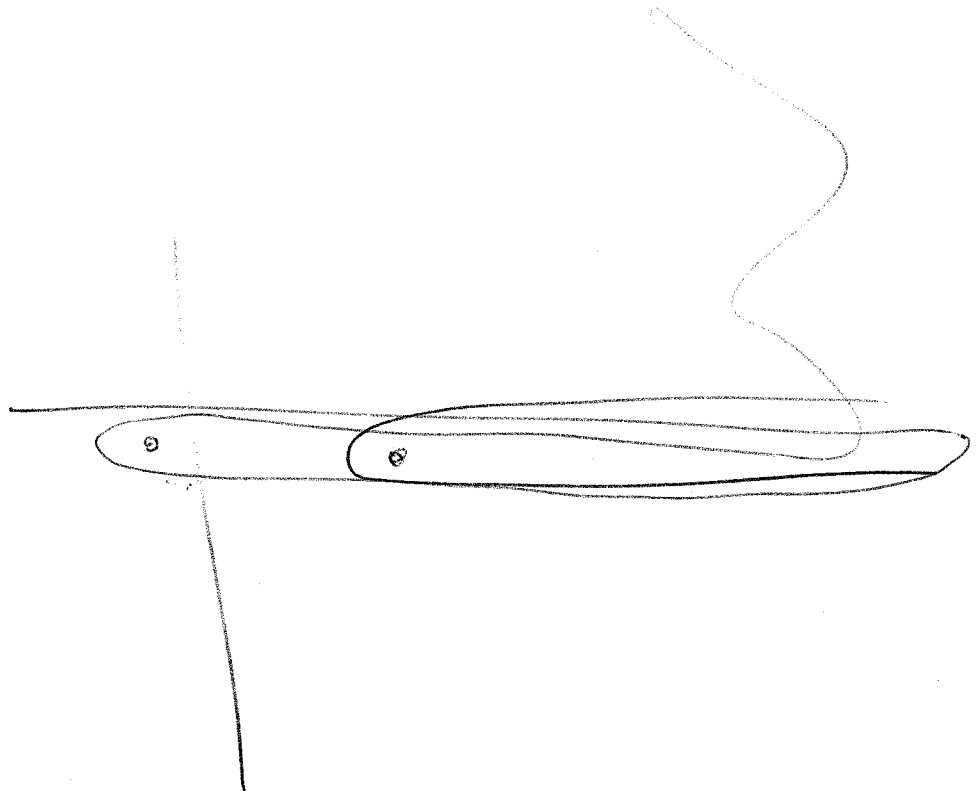

ENSIGN CLASS ASSOCIATION ANNUAL MEETING

Mystic, Connecticut -- February 8, 2003

Hosted by Fleet 57 at The Seamans Inn in historic Mystic, Connecticut, Commodore Robert B. Geary brought to order the Annual Meeting of the Ensign Class Association on February 8, 2003.

Roll Call of the fleets produced 36 members in attendance including the Governing Board in its entirety.

The minutes of the February 2, 2002 Annual Meeting were approved.

Past Commodores in attendance, Robert S. Jones, Richard I. Torpey and Zeke Durica were recognized and presented with Ensign hats embroidered with the new Ensign burgee logo and "Past Commodore."

OFFICERS REPORTS

The Commodore, Robert Geary, recognized the many contributions from ECA members including Dick Torpey who has taken on the responsibilities of the Contributions Committee, Ned Blake who will serve as Yearbook Editor and Dirk Van Zyverden who will retire as Yearbook Editor but who will continue to serve as Newsletter Editor.

The ECA gained exposure since its induction into the American Sailboat Hall of Fame and by our representation at boat shows including Annapolis, Maryland, Houston, Texas and Cleveland, Ohio.

The Class is vibrant and in good standing through its membership, volunteer participation, racing events and new boat building. The Commodore thanked everyone for their contributions.

ECA Board Secretary Elizabeth Brincklow

No Report at this time.

Treasurer Jorge Ibanez-Delgado reported the ECA has a balance of approximately \$18,000. He commended Kay Snider for a superb job in collecting Fleet 2 dues and submitting the payments as a group. This practice promotes strength as a fleet locally and nationally.

Vice Commodore, Regional Affairs, Ward Woodruff, announced the following dates and locations for the 2003 Regional events.

Region 1 - Centerport, N.Y. - June 7 - 8

Region 2/3 - Newport, R.I. - July 11 - 13

Region 4 - Houston, TX (in conjunction with ECA Nationals) - July 11 - 14

Region 5 - Cedarville, MI - July 18 - 19

Ward reported that the Governing Board approved a waiver requested by Region 4. The waiver requested that Region IV Regionals be held in conjunction with ECA Nationals.

Vice Commodore, Publicity, Alex Kampf reported approximately \$3700. in advertising. Chip Conner of The Club House was thanked for his attendance at the Annual Meeting and requested membership support for him. Chip displayed and sold ECA embroidered sportswear items during the Annual Meeting. Alex introduced and thanked Jack Patterson of Pentwater, MI who designed the member-selected design of the new Ensign burgee.

Alex announced the following new advertisers – the Sail Bag Lady who will be producing the ECA start flag and Bay Port Yachts.

Advertiser Chris Kogut's ECA photo board was on display. She was thanked for her support of the Ensign Class Association.

Alex encouraged members to support ECA advertisers.

Vice Commodore of Rules, Eric Jones, reported the outcome on the sail measurement problem at 2002 Nationals. Sails not measuring in were re-measured by the sailmaker and approved for use by the Governing Board. The Governing Board has stated the rules should not be changed. To avoid similar difficulties at the 2003 Nationals, Houston sailmakers will be on hand for assistance.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Webmaster Walt Pratt reported that access to the addresses and database will be restricted by password. Members will provide their own password.

There are many new items on the website including Past Champions, Most Beautiful Ensign Award winners and the history of Past Officers.

Walt is in process of updating fleet and regional information as well as links to individual fleet webpages. He suggested members send him e-mail with questions and/or suggestions.

Boat List Manager - Commodore Bob Gaary reported on behalf of Boat List Manager Sarah Statmore who was not in attendance. Sarah is working hard to match up buyers and sellers. There has been good traffic helped along by the active website.

Charitable organizations have made written requests for donated Ensigns. There has also been some interest in donating boats. Sarah will try to make the links happen to connect the interested parties.

New Boat Project - Zeke Dunca reported that business was slow after 9-11 and the company provided boat restoration service. This year is looking better for new boats, however - the 6th boat is underway and 2 more orders have come in.

Regarding used boats the market is going up which can be attributed to the new boats. Owners keeping their boats in good condition can expect the values to continue to increase and hold.

Zeke has modified his sales strategy since it is difficult to sell and build at the same time – so he is developing a nationwide dealer network. (A Charlotte fleet is in formation because of it).

Zeke was happy to report that a new deck fits a used boat beautifully. The new deck can be shipped but, ultimately, it is cheaper to bring the boat to the shop. The new deck has upgrades of backing plates and glassed in foam core.

He reported that a new one piece IGU (Integrated Glass Unit) replaces the wooden bunks and general cabin interior and floor. It can be installed easily with the deck off or without much difficulty when the deck is on.

Commodore Geary stated his delight with the new boat. He commended the excellent work to bring us to this fine position.

Technical Committee member Walt Prati reported that the Tech. Committee was working with the V.C.Rules and the Boatbuilder to incorporate the verbiage of the new boat parts into the rules (Part II Rules).

Jack Patterson asked if a fared-in and recessed rudder strap was legal. Vice Commodore of Rules reported it was not legal.

2003 Nationals - Fleet #2, the host fleet of the 2003 National Championship, was represented by Dave Hollister. He reported that Houston was preparing a great event. Houston is central to lots of areas of interest including NASA, historical museums and the theater district. Galveston Bay has 25 - 30 miles of undisturbed waters and the wind locks in at 135degrees for high quality sailing. There will be 6 races over 3 days. Some loaner boats are available – contact the Race Chairman early to secure a loaner boat.

The Commodore thanked and applauded Fleet 2's efforts for fine racing and social events. He encouraged the membership to support them by our participation.

Midwinters 2003 - Zeke Dunca, Co-Chair of the Midwinter event, reported that plans are underway for the annual midwinter event in Dunedin, Florida – March 20 -22. The local fleet is planning for good racing and social events. Come join us for a wonderful break from the cold north.

OLD BUSINESS

Statuses of Rules - There have been some questions about what is legal and what isn't and where it applies. One specific area has surfaced regarding the rights of local fleets to race using roller furlers. The Governing Board agreed that local fleets can vote to use items within their fleet, but fleets should formally vote on those items and then document their decisions. At ECA Regional and National racing events, however, ECA Rules apply.

ECA Copyright/Trademark - The rights to the ECA logo have been recorded/registered. The logo is the property of the ECA exclusively.

Protection of Archived ECA Records - The Commodore reported that most of the ECA archives are on paper and that there is discussion on how best to move forward in saving the archives. The ECA needs to be selective in what and how items are saved. If you have something that should be saved, send it to the Exec. Secretary.

NEW BUSINESS

2004 & 2005 Nationals - The 2004 Nationals are scheduled for Newport, RI, while for 2005 it is hoped Nationals will be held in Nyack, N.Y. The Commodore hopes that fleets will line up to host this event. It adds to the prestige of the event if fleets vie to host the National Championship.

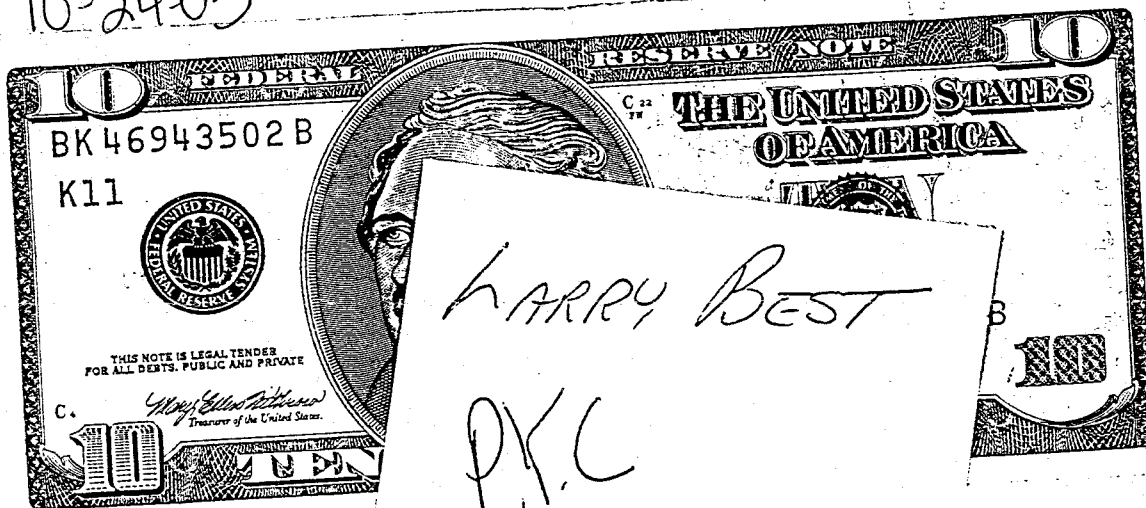



This is just my opinion. To obtain an official US SAILING interpretation of a racing rule, you must follow the process set out in racing rule 70.3 and Appendix F in the US SAILING rulebook.

A spinnaker pole attached to the clew of a headsail may be set on either the windward or the leeward side. However, when in use, it shall be attached to the mast (rule 50.2).

Formerly, the rules required that it only be set on the windward side. However, that requirement was eliminated a few years ago when some classes (especially the Tasar) asked why they could not set their whisker pole on the leeward side and we had no good answer.

I hope this helps.

Our Ensign fleet in Pentwater Michigan has a strong discussion going about Rule 50.3.b.2 regarding whether or not, except when gybing, a spinnaker pole used for a headsail and the mainsail boom may be carried on the same side of the mast. The controversy comes from the lack of explicit wording that prohibits that set.

I maintain that the wording infers that the spinnaker pole is assumed to be set in a normal spinnaker set manner - on the side of the mast opposite the main boom when either a spinnaker or other head sail is flown. Given that inference the conclusion maintains that only one pole may be set on either side of the mast.

Please enlighten us. A diner is at risk.

This would seem to be analogous to the Class Annual Meeting / Fleet relationship.

The Ensign starting procedure is the same one we have used at PYC for over 30 years. It is as follows, and works well for us.

1. 11:00 AM Yellow shape raised and horn sounded
2. 11:04 AM Yellow shape is lowered
3. 11:05 AM Blue shape is raised and horn is sounded
4. 11:09 AM Blue shape is dropped
5. 11:10 AM Red shape is raised and a horn is sounded to signal the start of the race.
6. Any boat that is over will be called by sail number, and should return to the starting area for restart.

This system has worked well for use and I do not anticipate any change in it at this time.

We have a starter that is learning the system and doing a good job. The alternate starter plan sounds like a good idea to me.

As for the idea of informal races on the big lake there are probably some skippers that would be interested. You must remember that there are no permits for these races registered with the authorities. They would have to be "informal" and you would have to use only the two marks already in the lake. To set any others would be a violation and could get our permit for the two permanent marks revoked.

I do not have any minutes for the Regatta committee so I don't know what they voted on as far as snacks are concerned. I have reviewed the minutes of the Ensign meetings and there is no mention of not having snacks. There was a motion made by Sturr and passed unanimously to use the dues money for trophies. I have discussed the problems we have been having getting our races started on time with some of the skippers. FOLLOWING YOU WILL FIND THE REVISED SAILING INSTRUCTIONS. We will try this to see if it alleviates some of the confusion and delays at the start of the races.

**SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
PRE RACE AND STARTING PROCEDURE**

1. There will be NO skippers meeting prior to each race.
2. Skippers will be required to enter their name and sail number on the race sheet for the race that day. This sheet is in the folder on the scorers table at the finish line.

I am just getting caught up with my e-mail and mail after returning from Maui. I have a little bit of a conflict. The desire to have as many people as possible involved is obviously a good one. However, I don't think our by-laws allow for absentee ballot voting, and I have a fiduciary duty to the club by virtue of being a board member.

The reason absentee ballot voting is not allowed is that a deliberative body, i.e. one making decisions, should have the opportunity to have informed discussion. The absent members will not have the opportunity to hear and be heard. That being said, I will try this weekend to find a way around this.

Although I have been saying for years (along with others, notably Bill Dehommel who asked that the Regatta Committee encourage the fleets to sail on Lake Michigan at the January 25, 2003 meeting) that we should take advantage of some of the best sailing in the world just a few hundred yards from our dock. There also can be advantages to Pentwater Lake sailing. It's not really an either/or issue. Flexibility is a better course. I don't think anyone would want to be out on the big lake in May or early June when it is still quite cold on Lake Michigan. The fleet has indicated for the last two years that we wanted to sail on the big lake, even though it hasn't happened yet.

There's really nothing to be afraid of out there. Any racing would likely take place fairly close to shore, and would be weather dependent. I think it would be great for the people on the beach to see a dozen spinnakers come streaming down at them. It might even generate some more interest in the club and sailing.

At the club level, racing is all about having fun and improving sailing skills. It is universally accepted by racing sailors that the best way to do this is with the modern standard upwind/downwind course. This has been recognized and called for by racing sailors in the club for thirty years. I recall two years ago seeing Tom Hendricks out there with the offshore fleet every week, even though his boat only has a center-board for stability, unlike our full keels. I also recall Al Rehnquist out there in his Cape Dory in 20 plus knots of wind last year. (Along with Bill Dehommel and Tom Sturr representing our fleet-I think it took two weeks to get the grins off their faces).

Since our fleet has now become so large, there is also a safety issue. Racing at the busiest point of the lake, at the busiest time of the day, on the busiest day of the week could cause some serious problems for both individuals and the club. I would hate to see any one of us cause damage to another boat, or worse injure another person, but I could easily see that happening in a congested area. Doing what I do, I can see that scenario snowballing into liability for the club because it was one of "our" races.

In any event, we can possibly make this decision at this meeting, or we can wait for these members to get back since we are going to have a meeting once

our Class Yearbook comes out.

I will be unable to be at a meeting on April 5 as it is spring break and we will be in Florida with Jean's mother. I understand the small boat races will be discussed (among other topics) and I have a few comments:

1. We should continue small boat races in Pentwater Lake. If some people want to race in Lake Michigan as their primary racecourse let them. The Saturday morning races have proven very popular with the sailors as well as the club membership (look at how many show up on the club dock to watch the start and finish). The community also seems to enjoy and take note of the races. I've heard many comments from visitors and residents alike about how they enjoy seeing the boats on the lake and how it just adds to the atmosphere of the community. Pentwater is a rare place where the community is so close to the racecourse and the boats can be watched for the whole time. You lose all that on the Big Lake.
2. With the number of Ensigns in the fleet, perhaps those who want to race on the Big Lake with the J-24's and other boats can do so if they like. However, it is my belief that there are enough boats and certainly enough interest to have Pentwater Lake races on Saturday mornings as well. We need to keep marks in Pentwater Lake for that as well as for the Wednesday night races and Sunfish and junior events.

3. Speaking as an Ensign sailor, I see a safety issue. Our boats don't have self-draining cockpits and I've taken green water over the bow on a "fairly calm" day. That rascal would have filled up pretty quickly with a couple more waves. Again, if some hearty types want to go out there in 20-25 knots of wind, feel free. For myself, and I'm sure I'm not alone in this, I've done that in my life and a little more relaxed and "fun" racing is what I intend to do.
4. I would like to see the club continue to be involved with "small boat" racing (say under 23 feet) on Pentwater Lake on Saturday mornings. It has been very popular and it sure appears interest remains very high. If that isn't what the club wants, then I'd propose that the Ensign Fleet 70 organize its Ensign races, with PYC involvement of course, on Pentwater Lake on Saturday mornings as an addition to any other race programs.



Do we have a policy regarding outboard motors. Rule 12C provides for leaving the motors attached to the bracket at the fleet's discretion. This is a little unclear, since 12A distinguishes between having the motor detached from the bracket, and having it unshipped. The argument could be made that 12C provides for the fleet's discretion to allow the motor to remain attached to the bracket, but not to shipped (attached to the transom). Has this been clarified since the 2002 yearbook?

It would be nice to discuss Rule 14, Safety equipment. Are we required to carry flares? Is everyone carrying ground tackle, horns, etc? I assume that everyone carries PFDs, but we should be sure about that.

Rule 14C allows electronic instruments, but provides that they not be electronically interfaced. I will install a switch which will interrupt the NMEA connection, although it seems reasonable simply to leave it to the skipper's honor not to use derived information (VMG, true wind, etc). Incidentally, I have never used those measurement during a race, although one of the fleet members has been very critical of the fact that I have this capability on the boat.
